The Green

We have now let the maintenance i.e spraying and scarifying to the groundskeeper of the Worcestershire Golf Club. He will be scarifying the green once a month and applying weed killer and fertiliser three times a month. The green, before the drought, was far better than it had been for many years but to go to the next stage it requires professionals.

Maintenance - Monday maintenance is now down to the dedicated few, who work like beaver from 9 till 5. This has paid off as the bulk of the work has been done. However, this has to be maintained and it would be good to see other club members taking participating.

The achievements have been - we have fixed 80% of the artificial grass to the paving stones and each week we reducing the amount of necessary maintenance.

As I have mentioned before, due to the chemicals and fuel being kept in the shed there is limited access for club members. This was stipulated in a health and safety audit.

If you look in the store room (back door) you will now find sufficient tools, neatly stored on the wall, to enable members to sweep and garden without going into the shed. Please keep it tidy.
