Car Parking

For those who are not aware of the Parking Permit Wheel you can register for a 2 hour residents parking permit if you pay your Council Tax to Malvern Hills District Council. This permit can be used in any car park within the MHDC area. The car park opposite the Splash is just a short walk up Swan Pool Alley and through the Secret Garden to the club house. The annual cost is £25 and can be done online. This would save people having to walk from College Road or further.

The Green

You will have noticed that the green is progressively getting faster as the grass is cut to 4.5-5 mm and due to the natural watering it is looking at its best. I would like to thank everyone for being patient during the refurbishment. We will never get a top rate billiard board bowling green due to our location but the refurbishment is on schedule and I am very pleased at the results

Unfortunately Worcestershire Bowling Association inspected the green when the grass was long at 7mm and would not give it a certificate for use for county matches, which affected a member's match who like me did not appreciate the situation.

The failure was due to the length of the grass, it was explained before their arrival that there was a lot of new growth and we wanted to get it established before cutting to its required height. Also we did not have any 2 meter distance markers. They gave me a list of their requirements in order for the green to be accepted. On 4th June I will be putting up 2m markers on the ditch bank permanently. Photos of these will be displayed at the clubhouse. I have talked to WBA at length and they are willing to return, when I am ready, to reinspect and approve. Once we have this certificate any club that comes along and says our green is substandard you are welcome to put two fingers up to them and say we have a certificate. I will let you know when we have it so no fingers yet! I cannot specify a particular date for these people to come so I would appreciate it if short mat players could co-operate. We are a lawn green bowling club first.

Green maintenance - we have been let down by Hamish McKinnon, our green contractor, and the ditch installation is satisfactory but not as I had intended. This will be rectified when we install an automatic irrigation system. Hamish is no longer cutting the green and passed the job, without my consent, on to a friend, who didn't want to be committed to cutting the grass on a regular basis. This was a blessing in disguise and I have now organised for Tony, who cuts another bowling green to start on Monday 4th June. He will cut it on a regular basis, Monday and Thursday mornings. As I have mentioned previously Monday is a maintenance day and should be kept aside for that purpose..

I will be asking for volunteers to cut the edges of the green, roll the green and weed the surrounding paths once a fortnight. This is essential work. Once a month we will have to lightly scarify the green.

I also need volunteers to help with watering the green on a regular basis during dry weather.

With increased use of the green we will have to give it plenty of TLC throughout the season to keep it looking at its best. Brian Palmer
