Short mat memberships were due at the end of September.

You need to pay your short mat subscription of £20 and fill in the enrolment form (The forms are available on the noticeboard (the one near the emergency exit door)

Note we are changing the little short mat booking diary for a bigger one which we will also use for booking in people to the clubhouse for Health & Safety reasons.

I see that the little diary for short mat has been filled in to book short mat spots some months ahead.

I need to point out that unless you have updated your membership you should not be booking future dates in the diary.

I have also seen time booked in the diary where people have not turned up to play, this is clearly not on... as it blocks space that could have been used by other members. As a consequence of that example, in future if you book a spot in the diary I will expect payment for that session being received (whether or not there has been any play). The bookings in the little diary are null and void as they will superceded by the use of the bigger diary.

The Green

The reconstruction of the green last autumn has now paid off. The green was reseeded and it has taken a long time to get the new grass well established. A contract has been let for maintenance of the green throughout the season and now the contractors will prepare the green for the winter, this will include overseeding. The green will have to be cut once or twice a month during the winter. At the beginning of this season we could not cut the green too short for fear of destroying work carried out earlier. Contractors will be at the Club Monday/Tuesday 15th and 16th October. If the weather is adverse it will be delayed a day or two. I would appreciate the cooperation of those using the club house during those days as the men will require to use the facilities of the club house.

If you see anything out of place or fallen over PLEASE PICK IT UP. i.e the green will be fenced off with white and red tape, if you see it blown over please put it back in place.

Bowl sizes

At this time of year, you may be thinking of changing, or buying, new/second hand bowls. Before you do this, I suggest that you first talk to Di, or myself, about what size and type of bowl is appropriate for you. The chart below (also on the notice board in the clubhouse) cross relates available sizes in metric and imperial measure.

Bowl sizes in Metric and Imperial measurement

Size	0	0	1	2	3	4	5
Diam (mm)	116	118	121	122.5	124	125.5	127
Diam (Inch)	4 9/16	4 11/16	4 3/4	4 13/16	4 7/8	4 15/16	5

Ladies generally use bowl sizes between 00 to 2, and men from 3 to 5. In addition, weight (ie medium (M) or heavy (H)), bias (narrow to wide) and their use on different bowling surfaces (ie outdoor, indoor) need careful consideration. Colour is a personal choice, ranging from the traditional black to every colour combination of the spectrum.

The Groundsman's lot

Your playing enjoyment is derived on the bowling green. The green is prepared by a green keeper/a club member and please remember that whoever it is he has a very difficult job. Often he is endeavouring to maintain a playing surface under adverse conditions. He is striving to grow grass for us to play on under all weather conditions. On our part we walk continually over the green, placing the mat without any consideration for wear, expecting to play afternoon and evening up to 7 days The result is that wear a week. shows in patches, or some disease develops on the green and the green keeper is criticised for his incompetence.

Never approach the green keeper regarding any criticism of the green - better still do not complain at all. Help him by your thoughtfulness and tolerance, knowing that he is endeavouring to give you the best conditions possible and simply must protect the green against too much play. Do nothing to damage the green, either in your delivery or in any other way. It is essential that you develop clean grassing of your bowl without any bump.
